"Who will atone for this?", asked St. Edith Stein with regard to the atrocities and cruelties of the Third Reich.

Who can at all make just atonement for the unjust war waged by our German people and for the cruel murder of the many millions of people in the concentration camps?

It is not at all possible for us humans to make amends for all that! But what is impossible for us humans is possible for God! Jesus has already accomplished the atonement for our guilt on the cross. In the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass we can accept this sacrifice of atonement of Jesus and sacrifice it.

Therefore, we invite everyone to follow the advice of the Mother of God, which she gave as early as in 1850 in Lichen through the shepherd Mikolaj, to save the people from plague and war:

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"People must pray the rosary and ask God for mercy. You are to collect monetary donations for Atonement Masses throughout the area. Everyone, even the poorest, should donate money.

The priests are to celebrate Holy Masses to ask God not to punish sinners with punishments and illnesses. When the priests - surrounded by the people - come before God, holding the Most Holy Body and the Precious Blood of Christ in their hands, they always ask Him for mercy, forgiveness of sins and blessings.

The Holy Masses save sinful humanity. The people should listen to their priests and not let themselves be separated from them, for without them they will go astray and perish."

"We acknowledge our wickedness, O Lord, and the iniquity of our fathers, for we have sinned against thee (...) Remember and do not break thy covenant with us" (Jer 14:20f)

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
